

As the new fundraising director for 2016-2017, I began during a time when the economy in the province was not doing well. We struggled to find donors for a gala that was so well sponsored in previous years.

There were 34 requests sent out in the months of October and November. The names for the request were from previous years and a few new ones were added in as well. At a presentation to the Regina Teacher-Librarians, we gained an additional sponsor.

Of the 34 requests that were sent out, we received 6 donations, for a total of \$6,975.00, which is far below the target of \$20,000.00.

The website is the key communication tool with those who promote and participate in the Willow Awards. During the summer of 2016, the website was compromised and needed to be rebuilt. A decision was made to change the website developer and host from HJ Linnen to Blacksun Design, Inc. This decision was made in part due to costs and to allow for easier access for updates. We thank HJ Linnen for their support over the years and look forward to a new relationship with Blacksun.

Designs for the new website were created during the fall and winter and the transfer of the website over to Blacksun was made at the end of March when voting concluded. One of our goals was to try to create a more interactive website with an efficient archive to track past winners and finalists. We also wanted to make the website more child-friendly. Currently, there is a temporary page in place. We anticipate that the new website will be live in the first weeks of June 2017.

The voting for the Willow Awards this year tracked a total of 15,524 votes for 2016. The Shining category is still the most popular by far with 89% of the total vote, similar to last year.

Once again, the SaskEnergy Willow Awards Gala was live-streamed through the website to ensure that as many fans across Saskatchewan could view this special event. This year, there were 37 views (classes or others) who joined in live during the Gala.


























#### PROGRAM: DIAMOND WILLOW SELECTION COMMITTEE REPORT






















## PROGRAM: SNOW WILLOW SELECTION COMMITTEE REPORT



























#### THE 14TH ANNUAL SASKENERGY WILLOW AWARDS GALA

Jolie Brewer, teacher-librarian at MacNeill Elementary School in Regina, along with MacNeill's Willow Ambassadors, a club of grade 5-8 students, hosted The Saskatchewan Young Readers' Choice Awards – The Willow Awards Gala, on Friday, May 13, 2016. The event was live streamed throughout the province so all students could witness the anticipated announcement of the Willow Award winners.

The day began with wonderful author visits from Alison Lohans and Rona Arato, both finalists for the 2015 Willow Awards. The students welcomed the authors and enjoyed listening to their personal stories regarding their books.

The Mistress of Ceremonies, a poised Abigail Sadowski, began the Gala at 1:15 pm. After the singing of O'Canada, the program included a variety of special guest speakers, one of which was Elder Betty McKenna. Elder Betty began her talk by sharing the history of the willow tree in First Nations' culture. Sacred stories were told in a special place and willow trees were used to create that special place. First Nations people began with 1 willow branch, then 2, then 4, until they collected 40 willow branches, to construct a sweat lodge. The sweat lodge was a place where sacred stories were first shared. Elder Betty then connected writing a story to the use of willow trees in the construction of a sweat lodge. Like a sweat lodge that starts with one willow tree, a story begins with one word. This one word grows into a sentence, then a paragraph, a chapter and finally into a special book. The significance of this connection is that without willow trees there would not have been a special place for First Nations to share their sacred stories. Elder Betty's impactful message intertwined well with the value the Willow Awards places on stories.

Further highlights of the program consisted of a PowerPoint presentation featuring students' artwork of the finalist books and a song titled "Books" presented by the MacNeill School choir. Additional special guests included: Regina Councillor Barbara Young, Leslie Gosselin, from SaskEnergy, and other representatives from Regina Public Library, Affinity Credit Union, Twin Lakes Community Association and MacNeill School Community Council.

All in attendance were excited to hear the announcement of the winners. The Shining Willow Award went to Linda Bailey for *If Kids Ruled the World*. Linda Bailey was unable to attend but sent a heartfelt acceptance speech via video.

The Diamond Willow Award went to Rona Arato for **The Last Train: A Holocaust Story**. When Rona's name was announced the crowd of students roared with excitement!
