- promote reading of Saskatchewan and/or Canadian books by conducting the award, and by developing incentives for young readers to participate;
- develop and ensure implementation of SYRCA Saskatchewan Young Readers' Choice The Willow Awards, Inc. policies;
- encourage community involvement in all levels of SYRCA- Saskatchewan Young Readers' Choice – The Willow Awards, Inc. activity;
- cooperate with other organizations and groups in order to maximize the use of limited resources;
- ensure that SYRCA Saskatchewan Young Readers' Choice The Willow Awards, Inc. is managed in a financially responsible, prudent and ethical manner.

The Saskatchewan Young Readers' Choice Awards, "The Willow Awards" Inc. Board of Directors met five times during the 2013 - 2014 year. We are pleased that all 15 positions on the Board were filled this year. Midway through the year we accepted Margot Mack's resignation, and appointed Leanne Forrest (Regina) to fill the position for the remainder of the term.

Organizational Structure

We acknowledge the provincial nature of our board and make every effort to recruit board members from across Saskatchewan. To facilitate our geographical distance, we hold meetings by SKYPE conference calls if we are not able to meet face to face. We continue to work toward a practical and equitable division of board related tasks. During the 2013 - 2014 fiscal year, the Board continued to review and update our Policy Manual, which will be available from our new website.

Fiscal Responsibility

The positive financial statement reflects the Board's serious attention to fiscal responsibility. The very successful fundraising campaign under the leadership of Board member Naomi Kral provided funds to provide programming and further improve the Willow website. The Board continues to promote SYRCA membership through local fundraisers each year. Board members and volunteers also set up displays and offer book talks at events such as conferences and meetings. A small reserve fund provides a measure of fiscal security for SYRCA.

Communication

The Willow Awards website is the major communication tools for the public, publishers and authors. It is continuously evaluated and updated to meet the increasing demands of an online world. Thank you to web chair Val Gerrard for her knowledgeable leadership, and direction in the development of our new website. We distribute posters and bookmarks by mail to every school division, for distribution to every school in the province, in addition to all public libraries. This year we also included temporary tattoos in our mail outs, which were very favourably received. SYRCA news continues to be posted regularly on the website.

Sustainability

SYRCA continues to promote The Willow Awards across the province and voter numbers increase each year, a measure that the program is growing. Attempts to recruit Board members from different areas of Saskatchewan have been successful and are ongoing. We continue to expand the membership and volunteer base.

Programming

The Willow Awards receives many positive comments about book selection, related activities found on the website, events like the launch and gala and prizes offered to classrooms and individual students. A great deal of attention is directed to activities and rewards that will encourage children to be lifelong readers.

After the voting deadline this year, a survey was sent to all voters. Questions were asked regarding awareness of aspects of the program, willingness to offer financial support, and asking for suggestions to

improve the program. In the fall, we hope to develop a new five-year plan that will incorporate voters' suggestions.

SYRCA "The Willow Awards" Inc. appreciates the generous support of our patrons, sponsors, donors, friends and members. On behalf of the SYRCA Board of Directors, I would like to thank each of you for your commitment to literacy and the children of Saskatchewan. I would also like to thank the volunteer Board members who have devoted countless hours to ensure the success of the organization. They are a creative, hardworking group of people who cheerfully share their time, talents and endless enthusiasm for fulfilling the SYRCA mandate, to promote reading among Saskatchewan children and youth. This has been my third year as president and I would like to thank the Board members for their support and encouragement in allowing me to fill this role.

The SYRCA Annual Report reflects the success of the 2013 – 2014 operating year. Minutes of the 2012 – 2013 Annual General Meeting will be available at the May 24, 2014 Annual General Meeting.

It seems that fundraising is a necessary fact of life if the Saskatchewan Young Readers' Choice Awards – Willow Awards Inc. continues in its endeavor to promote reading for children in the province. As the fundraising officer, I develop a package of materials and include a letter to highlight the activity around

the province and how the Board needs the continued support of patrons from various locations and sectors such as agricultural, mining, financial institutions, educational institutions and the media. This year a number of online applications were made to a variety of organizations.

On behalf of the Board, I would like to acknowledge the continued support of our Gold Patron namely, PotashCorp, who contributed \$5,000 to help promote reading in the province. Silver Patrons donating \$3000 or more include Evraz, Conexus Credit Union, and The Leader Post and The Star Phoenix. SaskEnergy has promoted the Willows Gala from the start and contributes \$3500 as a Silver Patron. Book and Brier Patch, Areva, Cameco, Garnett Industries Limited, SGI, Redhead Equipment, and United Library Services returned as Bronze patrons contributing \$1000 each and we are very grateful for their support. We continue to look for support from new patrons around the province and we welcome H.J. Linnen as a new Gold Patron for 2014.


This year the Board did a survey with people who submitted votes for the winning authors. An interesting misconception people articulated within the survey was that they thought school boards were making donations to help send out posters to their schools. The reality is that the SYRCA Board has been handling these costs through provincial fundraising.

Buffet and Books, a fundraising dinner, was held in Regina on April 9, 2014 with guest author, Melanie Schnell speaking about the importance of communication with characters in a novel. As the fundraising officer, I think it is important for me to communicate that SYRCA needs more support across Saskatchewan in rural and urban areas to continue to promote literacy for children in our province.

Stickers are one-inch square circles with our Willow logo imprinted on it. These are available on black background for nominated books and on gold foil background for the winners. They can be ordered by downloading a copy of our order form from our website. Since April 2013, we have sold a total of \$922.00 worth of stickers. Compared to the \$1,152.45 sold in 2012 – 2013, annual sticker sales are down by 20% or \$240.45.







Every year, Saskatchewan schools and public libraries are invited to participate in a province-wide launch of the Willow nominees. During October and November participants can enter a competition to win a complete set of 30 nominated books by submitting a photo (photos) and/or a description of their local launch. Winners are randomly drawn. This year's winners were Tracy Aulie from Clive Draycott School (Bethune), Christine Steigbeil, Mossbank School (Mossbank), and Kimberley Black, William Mason School (Choiceland). Honourable mention went to Tracy Aulie, South Shore School (Regina Beach), Lori-Ann Stiglitz, St. Francis School (Prince Albert), and Donna Lindstrom, Grant Road School (Regina), each receiving a box of 30 assorted books.

The website is the key communication tool with the membership and participants in the Willow Awards. Thanks to the generous donation of HJ Linnen Associates who developed, hosts and maintains it, a new website was launched on March 7, 2014. It is still under development with the full site available by the summer of 2014.

The Willow program continues to grow in popularity with over 700 more students casting votes this year than last, totaling 13,354 for the 2013 Willow nominees.
