


















PROGRAM: DIAMOND WILLOW SELECTION COMMITTEE REPORT


















PROGRAM: SNOW WILLOW SELECTION COMMITTEE REPORT


























THE ANNUAL SASKENERGY WILLOW AWARDS GALA

A Walk Through the Willows

Assiniboia Park Elementary School in Weyburn, under the leadership of teacher Tammy Manning, hosted the 2015 SaskEnergy Willow Awards Gala. The morning of Thursday, May 14, 2015 was fairly cool and cloudy, but the sun was definitely shining on this special event all day. When we arrived at Assiniboia Park Elementary (APES), the entrance was transformed into a Walk Through the Willows, with posters and real willow trees lining the hallway. The entire school was immersed in The Willows, because in every hallway and classroom there were displays of art and writing projects celebrating the 30 nominated books, and everywhere you looked there were creatively crafted willow trees

Although the theme for the Gala was A WALK THROUGH THE WILLOWS, this Gala was all about "Total Immersion." Every student, staff member, and parent volunteer wore a black and white T-shirt with the Willows Logo on the front. Every student in the school played an active role in the Gala. The Gym was arranged with guests in the centre and a small stage at the front. Around the edges of the gym were Grades 5 & 6 students arranged in tableaux of many of the nominated books, and on one side of the gym were the Kindergarten to Grade 4 students on risers.

The program featured greetings from several dignitaries and these greetings were interspersed with interviews of the students in the tableaux. We learned a lot about some of the nominated books.

During the Gala two fabulous musical numbers were presented. The first was The Tree Song, performed with actions by the Kindergarten to Grade 4 Chorus. The second was a performance of K'Naan's song, Wavin' Flag by the Chorus, featuring a full verse introduction by the Grade 4 Recorder Ensemble. What a moving tribute to one of the nominated books.

Then the time came to announce the winners. The winner of the Shining Willow Award was K'Naan for When I Get Older: The Story Behind "Wavin' Flag". Sadly, K'Naan was not in attendance to accept his award, but the students were very pleased that he had won. The winner of the Diamond Willow Award was David Carroll for Ultra. David came from Toronto to accept his award, and he was extremely excited to receive an award chosen by students. The winner of the Snow Willow Award was Lisa Harrington for Live to Tell. Lisa was so excited to come all the way from Halifax to see the prairies for the very first time, and she was also thrilled to win a Readers' Choice award.

Leslie Gosselin, the representative from SaskEnergy, presented the school with a willow tree to be planted as a remembrance of hosting the Gala. The President of the Saskatchewan Young Readers' Choice Awards, Ruth Garnett, presented APES with a set of 30 nominated Willow books for the 2015-2016 year, along with a commemorative plaque for hosting the Gala.

Following the wonderful, child-centred Gala, a reception was held in the Library. What a truly celebratory day of immersion as we Walked through the Willows.


