

## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The Board of Directors of the Saskatchewan Young Readers' Choice Awards (SYRCA), The Willow Awards Inc., met five times during the 2021-2022 year.

The board said good-bye to Heather Dolmage and Hannah Patterson who stepped down at the end of 2020-2021 year and welcomed Joanne Patron as a co-fundraising director, creating a board of twelve members.

This year was an exciting year for The Willow Awards organization as we commemorated our 20th Anniversary. The board's focus was to look back at how the organization reached this achievement, promote this celebratory year and provide commemorative contests to engage our readers.

Along with our regular online and mailout communications and promotions, a main priority for the board in our anniversary year was to create a historical overview and archive our journey thus far through a variety of documents posted on our website for posterity. In addition to chronicling the past, The Willows was also able to promote our achievements through a CBC radio interview and print ads. We were again privileged to promote The Willow Awards to future educators at the University of Regina and University of Saskatchewan.

As well as our regular yearly events, two anniversary contests were created to celebrate and encourage participation. We held a 20th Anniversary Author Contest, and a 20th Anniversary All-Star Contest with a special online poster created to highlight past winners in all three awards categories. Authors generously gave of their time and nine contest winning schools from across the province were able to enjoy visits with Willow authors.

Another highlight for the anniversary year was The Willow Awards receiving the Saskatchewan Library Association's first Distinguished Service Award at their annual conference. The Willow Board was honoured to be acknowledged for our 20 years of promoting quality Canadian literature to the young people of Saskatchewan.

This was our third year dealing with the Covid-19 pandemic. As a non-profit volunteer run organization, fundraising continues to be critical to keeping The Willow Awards operational. We are extremely grateful to all our sponsors, patrons and friends for their support in helping us achieve our fundraising goal in spite of all the difficulties that Covid has caused. The Willow Awards also relies heavily on book lovers both young and old across this province for our continued operation and success and the board truly thanks everyone for their support in the midst of upheaval.

From the awards inception, there have been many volunteer board and reading committee members who have been instrumental to ensuring The Willow Awards was able to reach this important milestone. I would like to sincerely thank everyone who has had a hand in helping us attain this accomplishment. I would also like to thank our talented and magnanimous current board who put countless hours into making this 20th anniversary celebration year a success as we strove to highlight the past, celebrate with our readers and carry The Willow Awards into the future.

The SYRCA Annual Report reflects the ongoing work and successes of the 2021-2022 operating year. Minutes of the 2020-2021 Annual General Meeting will be available at the September 17, 2022 Annual General Meeting, which will be held through Zoom this year.

#### **FUNDRAISING REPORT**

Saskatchewan Young Readers' Choice Awards is a non-profit, volunteer-run, charitable organization that relies solely on donations to cover our expenditures. Currently, The Willow Awards has five different supporter levels: **Gold Patron** \$5,000 or more; **Silver Patron** \$3,000 - \$4,999; **Bronze Patron** \$1,000 - \$2,999; **Sponsors** \$500 - \$999; and **Friends** \$100 - \$499.

Thanks to the generosity of our long-time donors, the SYRCA - The Willow Awards, Inc. was able to meet and exceed our fundraising goals this year. We raised a total of \$14,549.65 through sponsor donations. We want to give a special thanks to our longest-standing donors.

## LAUNCHING THE WILLOW FINALISTS

Each year, every school and library in the province is encouraged to launch the new Willow Award finalists. They introduce these great books to their reading communities in many creative ways! We want to share the wonderful work teachers, teacher-librarians, librarians and the staff of schools have done to promote this quality literature. During October and November, participants can enter a competition to win a complete set of 30 nominated books by submitting a photo(s) and/or a description of their local launch, such as bulletin boards, guest readers, book talks or a special project.

It was exciting to see so many schools promoting the reading of the Willow finalists in our 20th year! We recognize the challenges that many have been facing during this past year and have been encouraged by the positive messages that we have received about the current titles, our 20th anniversary contests and the Willow Awards in general. The constant that is always so good to hear about is the excitement and enjoyment that classes and students are experiencing through their exposure to the Willows, regardless of how it is done.

Here are a few of the ideas shared with us this year:

- Setting up a race car track to showcase student's reading of the Willows
- Sets of Willow finalists traveling from classroom to classroom
- Book "tastings" to create interest in the Diamond and Snow Willow finalists
- Booktalks and readings through zoom chats and posted through QR codes
- Partnerships between schools and public libraries
- Judging a book by its cover and comparing the pre-reading vote to a post-reading vote
- Using Willow titles as part of a "Battle of the Books" program
- Setting up book brackets continue to be popular and get many classes excited throughout a school
- We received wonderful pictures of displays and bulletin boards.

# **COMMUNICATIONS REPORT**

Communicating information about the Willow Awards across the province is a team effort by the Willow Board. To help coordinate this, our Saskatchewan Library Association rep, Judy Nicholson, has continued to work this past year on a communication strategy that will provide a guide for future members of the board to follow. We are striving to make sure that the message that reaches everyone about the Willows is widespread and consistent.

Representatives from two organizations have members on the board. The first is the Saskatchewan Library Association (SLA). The second is the Literacy Educators' and Resources Network (LEARN), an amalgamation of two organizations, the Literacy Educators Network of Saskatchewan (LENS) and the Saskatchewan School Library Association (SSLA). These people are instrumental in sharing information about the Willows with leading literacy promoters in our province.

Our Communications Director is our liaison between the board and publishers across Canada. She contacts them asking for submissions early in our yearly cycle and communicates with them regarding finalist choices and winners as this information becomes available.

Communicating with past and potential sponsors is the ongoing job of the Fundraising Director and is outlined in the Fundraising report.

Co-ordinating the distribution of posters and bookmarks to schools, and libraries across the province falls to two members on the Board. This is an important visual communication piece and one that we hope all children in the province see at some point during the year. This year 60 000 bookmarks and 3000 posters were sent out to 317 libraries and 851 schools across the province.

The Willow Awards website continues to be the primary communication tool for everyone who needs information about the Willows. On the website, visitors can find information about books, authors, illustrators and publishers. Also included are activities to promote literacy through the use of the Willow titles. To help promote each of the Willow books, pdf's of the book covers are available for printing to aid in making displays, there are printable versions of the bookmarks and a smaller version of the poster, as well as pictures showcasing ideas used to promote the Willows. The website also includes an online form for submitting votes and printable ballots for use by voters. There are links to past Gala celebrations as well as an archive of past Willow titles. Additions were made this year to celebrate our 20th anniversary including the uploading of all of our previous AGM reports, pdf's of past posters and a document that outlines the history of The Willows. A contact form that allows participants to easily communicate with the board is managed by the President and fields many inquiries about the Willows, both specific and general. Our website is hosted by Blacksun Design Inc. and we are appreciative of their continued support. We continue to receive positive comments from individuals using the site and hope that visitors find it a useful tool. People can visit our website at willowawards.ca.

As a result of our fiscal year changing, highlights for the 2021 and 2022 Gala celebrations are included in this annual report. For both these Galas, COVID-19 restrictions prevented us from hosting the Gala celebration with the winning authors. In the past, we have live-streamed the Gala event on our website so that all Saskatchewan children could watch as the winners were announced. In 2021, students and staff at Wilfred Hunt School, Regina, Saskatchewan introduced and celebrated the winning authors virtually. Their video messages were posted on our website, after the event, to announce the winners to the province. In 2022, Regina Public Library's Regent Place Branch hosted a combined virtual and in person celebration, with the authors participating virtually. Willow enthusiasts were able to watch the Gala live or a recorded version posted on our website.

Another tool used to communicate Willow Awards news includes emails via Mailchimp, which individuals can subscribe to during the voting process or from our website. Facebook and Twitter also continue to be platforms where we disseminate information about The Willow Awards. Follow us on Facebook and Twitter @willowawards. Use #willowawards when "tweeting" about The Willows. We appreciate feedback from our users regarding improvements we can make in any of these areas.

# THE 20th ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATIONS



2021 has been a special time for SYRCA as we have been celebrating our 20th anniversary of bringing quality Canadian children's literature to the children and youth of our province. Over 20 years, there have been a total of 600 nominated books, and 60 winners – all quality Canadian children's literature. The thousands of children and youth involved in reading and voting for their favourite books over this time is huge!

To help commemorate this milestone, we wanted to encourage schools, classrooms and libraries to engage in a variety of student opportunities for enrichment associated with this special event. The current board of SYRCA, (2021-2022), collaborated over the last 2 years to bring together resources and activities to mark this important milestone in the history of The Willow Awards in our province. These include:

**Branding/marketing** - A special 20th anniversary logo was created to be used throughout the year as well as a poster for each award that showcased the winners for the past 19 years. These posters were available to download as a PDF on the Willow Awards website. See pictures of the anniversary posters at the bottom of this article.

**Honouring the history** – An article recapping the history of the awards was circulated and posted on the website along with documents from the past 20 years. The annual report as well as the posters for each year were also posted there.

**Promotions** - Regular articles, press releases, and ads were published to highlight the events of the anniversary year. This included an advertisement in the Saskatchewan Teachers' Federation publication, *The Bulletin* and an interview on CBC radio's Saskatchewan Weekend hosted by Shauna Powers.

**Two Contests** - With the help of many of our 2021 Willow finalist authors, one of the most exciting opportunities we provided this year were our two contests, running from September - March. For both contests, we received entries from across the province. It was



exciting to see them come in! The first contest was the **20th Anniversary All-Star Contest** where we asked Willow promoters to send us pictures of the Willow books that they have in their library collections. Many thanks to everyone who took the time to find these great titles and bring them to the attention of their library patrons! Each picture sent was an entry to win a zoom visit with one of our 2021 finalist authors who have won a Willow Award in the past, our Willow All-Stars.

- Kathy Kacer, author of *The Brushmaker's Daughter* (Diamond finalist 2021) and *I Am Not A Number* (Diamond winner 2017) George Lee School, Regina was the winner of a zoom visit with her.

The second contest was the **20th Anniversary Author Contest**. Six more 2021 Shining, Diamond and Snow finalist authors offered to provide teachers a chance to win a virtual visit or reading. Here are the featured authors and winners:

- October's featured author was Heather M. O'Connor, Shining Award finalist for *Fast Friends*. The zoom visit was won by Jack Mackenzie School, Regina.
- November's featured author was Tziporah Cohen, Diamond Award finalist for *No Vacancy*. The zoom visit was won by James Hamblin School, Qu'Appelle.
- December's featured author was Mike Stewart, Snow Award finalist for *Heart Sister*. The zoom visit was won by Chief Little Pine School, Paynton.
- January's featured authors were The Fan Brothers, Shining Award finalist for *The Barnabus Project*. The zoom reading was won by Spruce Home Public School, Prince Albert.
- February's featured author was Gina McMurchy-Barber, Diamond Award finalist for *The Jigsaw Puzzle King*. The zoom visit was won by Davidson School, Davidson.
- March's featured author was Colleen Nelson, Snow Award finalist for *Spin*. The zoom visit was won by Ecole Community School, Regina.

We would like to extend a huge thank you to the authors who gave so freely of their time. Many teachers and teacher-librarians shared the excitement of their students with us. Your time was greatly appreciated!

**Gala** - This year's gala included additional anniversary celebrations which can be viewed in the gala report.

The purpose of these anniversary activities has been to celebrate The Willows' longevity with our readers and to acknowledge all of those who have made The Willows possible over the years. This longevity can be attributed to a variety of factors. Our volunteer network is incredible! It includes our hard-working board members who have created a stable and sustainable organization since its visioning in the fall of 2000. This has included ongoing involvement of the Saskatchewan Library Association, (SLA), and the Saskatchewan School Library Association (SSLA) and the Literacy Educators Network of Saskatchewan (LENS) joined now into the Literacy Educators and Resources Network (LEARN).

We have also had many volunteers serve on our three reading committees. Over 20 years, they have read between 300 and 500 nominated titles each year, approximately 10,000 books since our inception. We have also appreciated the tremendous support our organization has received from teachers, teacher-librarians, librarians, and families that have engaged students with the finalist books. This has happened through displays, in-school and library programs, launch and gala events, and voting for their favourites.

In addition to our wonderful volunteers, we wanted to acknowledge our financial supporters who have been an integral part of The Willow Awards. Thanks go to all individuals, companies and organizations that have provided funds each year to support our work. A special thanks goes to SaskEnergy for their ongoing support of the annual Gala event. Also, the Willow Awards would not have been successful without the aid of publishers that submit



# **2021 WILLOW FINALIST VOTING REPORT**

The main purpose of the Willow Awards is to promote reading and great Canadian Literature among Saskatchewan children and youth. We gauge our success through the voting that occurs in the spring each year. Voters embrace the role of literary critic. They are excited to know that what they think matters and they eagerly await the announcement of the winners at the spring Gala.

In the past, voting closed on March 31st. This allowed time to contact winning authors and make arrangements for them to travel to participate in the Gala celebration near the end of May. This last year, our voting timeline was again affected by circumstances around the COVID-19 pandemic. Both last year and this year, promoting the Willows in schools was challenging with COVID-19 protocols in place. Students were not able to access the Willow books as easily when they were at school and not able to take books home to read. With many staff and students dealing with illness, interruptions to learning meant that promoting and reading of the Willow finalists was difficult. As the March 31st voting deadline approached, the number of votes that we had received was significantly lower than previous years. A decision was made, once again, to extend voting until April 14th.

COVID-19 isn't the only challenge that we have faced in recent years. We are seeing fewer vote submissions made by teacher-librarians across the province. At one time, TL's were our biggest advocates, spearheading the purchase, promotion and reading of the Willows in their schools. Recent years have seen a significant reduction in the number of teacher-librarians and library support personnel in the province as well as the amount of time they are assigned to work as TL's. We fear that this may also be a factor in our reduced voting numbers and are seeking further ways that The Willows can be introduced and promoted in schools.

Through all of the challenges that this year has brought to our communities, we are awed by the continued participation of teachers, teacher-librarians, librarians, library technicians and parents in encouraging children to read these great books! Votes were submitted from across the province, from rural and small-town schools as well as schools in the larger urban centres. We had votes submitted from public libraries and from parents who are homeschooling their children. Once again, our voting numbers were lower than we would like to see. We are hopeful for the future when the pandemic isn't dominating our lives.
























# PROGRAM: DIAMOND WILLOW SELECTION COMMITTEE REPORT























# PROGRAM: SNOW WILLOW SELECTION COMMITTEE REPORT


This year the Snow Committee received 62 books. This was a lower year for us, but we still had difficulty in narrowing it down to just ten books because they were all so good!



























# THE ANNUAL SASKENERGY WILLOW AWARDS GALA 2021

# THE 20th ANNUAL SASKENERGY WILLOW AWARDS GALA 2022

The 2021-2022 voting year was special as The Willow Awards celebrated its 20th Anniversary. The Regina Public Libraries, Regent Branch, hosted the 20th Anniversary of the SaskEnergy Willow Awards Gala on Wednesday, June 1st through a live virtual zoom event to culminate this milestone year. Regina Public Library staff, Robin Berg and Courtney Bates-Hardy planned and executed the online event along with support from Terry Wiest and Jo Sheppard.

The gala was privileged to have the Honourable Lieutenant Governor, Russ Mirasty attend and bring greetings on behalf of her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. His Honour emphasized the diversity that The Willow Awards highlights through the nominated authors and books and in the spirit of that diversity also brought greetings in his first language Woodland Cree. He addressed the children and youth of the province, spotlighting the importance of their participation and reading great literature and encouraged young readers to "continue to let your imagination lead you on fantastic adventures".





Special guest, Allix Schweitzer, the SaskEnergy representative, expressed Saskenergy's pleasure to have partnered with The Willow Awards for more than 15 years in promoting literacy in schools. She particularly highlighted the fact that The Willows helps promote a "love of reading that lasts a lifetime".

Jeff Barber, the Director and CEO of Regina Public Libraries, next brought thanks and congratulations, on behalf of the libraries, to The Willow Award organization for its many years of dedicated service to promoting Canadian literature and inspiring young readers.

The Willow Awards is all about giving voice to the young people of Saskatchewan, so it was wonderful to be able to have a number of students from various schools be involved in the gala. Janaye and Kyler, from George Lee School, in Regina, did a wonderful and professional job as the Masters of Ceremony.





Mrs. Gail Veikle's students from the Huda School, in Regina, did an excellent job of presenting the 2022 Shining Willow finalists and announcing the winners of the Shining Willow Award, *The Barnabas Project* by The Fan Brothers, with a round of cheers.

The Fan Brothers shared how thrilled they were to be nominated and then to win and expressed their gratitude to the young people of Saskatchewan for giving them such a meaningful award because it was chosen by their readers. They explained how the idea for *The Barnabus Project* started over 30 years ago before finally becoming a published book. They thanked teachers and librarians for bringing Canadian books to children and their families, publisher, agent and Tundra Books for their support.

Krystal and Morgan from Anaheim School, in Anaheim, presented the 2022 Diamond finalists and Mr. Graham Brace's students, Olivia, Zoe, Alia and Thomas, from Ruth Pawson School, in Regina, announced the winner of the



Diamond Willow Award, Notorious by Gordon Korman.



Gordon Korman shared a taped acceptance speech expressing what an honour it was to receive an award decided by Saskatchewan students. He described how *Notorious* is a special book for him, not unlike the town in the book that straddles the Canada- U.S. border he experienced in his own life. He also had this book idea decades earlier. He explained that he wrote his first book at age 14 and over the last 44 years he has written 100 novels. The reason he is still writing "is because of programs like The Willow Awards" and kids "reading his stuff, enjoying it, laughing in all the right places- that means everything to me."

Janaye and Kyler, the Masters of Ceremony, announced the winner of the Snow Willow Award, *The King of Jam Sandwiches* by Eric Walters.



Eric Walters explained how *The King of Jam Sandwiches* is a special book as it is based on his own life and shared how children's choice awards are the most important awards he receives. He expressly shared his love for Saskatchewan and the contributions of its people to Canada and left the students of the province this inspirational message, "What I want you to remember more than anything else, is that you come from a place where great people come from. That you can become great. I hope our stories give you a little insight into other places, some other people, some empathy. Remember who you are. You are from Saskatchewan-Be proud!"
